MEMORANDUM OPINION

In this involuntary petition, the issue is whether the alleged debtor is "generally not paying such debtor's debts as such debts become due" under 11 U.S.C. §303(h) (1).

The evidence discloses that the debtor, in general, is meeting his obligations to his creditors.

The main petitioning creditor, Cloverleaf, Inc., holds a debt which is disputed by the debtor. Given the evidence which suggests that Mr. Worster is meeting obligations to other creditors, including what appear to be reasonable repayment of his obligations which arose from his guarantee of corporate debts, I conclude that the disputed debt of Cloverleaf, Inc. should be decided by a separate court. Setting aside the debt of Cloverleaf, Inc., I conclude that Mr. Worster is generally paying his debts as they become due.

A separate order of dismissal is entered in accordance with the foregoing.
